TREASURER REPORT (Wayne Grunewald)

Our cash position has improved since my last Treasurer Report to you.

Alumni contributed \$10,100 during the past 12 months, of which \$8,500 (85%) has come through donations to Carroll University, with DRU as the designated recipient. This has become an excellent way for DRU Alumni to donate money at the same time to both Carroll and DRU.

70% of our recent expenses have been in support of the DRU Active Body, as we have committed to paying for 30% of the Carroll-required liability insurance policy premium and for the Clubhouse rental. Due to our improved financial condition, we have recently agreed to increase our monthly rent payment for the Clubhouse from \$100 per month to \$250 per month to allow for improved Clubhouse services for the Actives. We have also implemented a \$1,800 per semester dues reimbursement program for the Actives to reward community stewardship, DRU commitment and academic achievement. 30% of our expenses have been in support of Alumni social events and communications.

Your continued financial support is very much appreciated to help pay for our Active Body financial commitments (about \$8,200 per year beginning in 2017) and for DRU Alumni Association ongoing costs.

HISTORIAN UPDATE (Adam Rygg)

This year marked the 7th Annual "History Day" event between the Alumni Association and Active Chapter.

Each year we break open the DRU vault and give a new crop of Actives the opportunity to learn more about the history of our heart organization as chronicled by those men who lived it. Photo albums, meeting minutes, artifacts, trinkets, awards, yearbooks, and the like are viewed by fresh eyes, thereby helping to keep the legacy of DRU alive in the minds of those still in the position to add to it.

What's more, verbal histories are shared in both directions with the Actives telling any alumni in attendance about their experiences in the brotherhood. We tend to get lesser alumni attendance than I would personally like to see, but those who come have been varied over the years as well so we're getting fresh perspectives each time we gather for this purpose.

History Day has traditionally been scheduled for the weekend prior to the Super Bowl and is held at the Clubhouse just off campus. If you are able, please save the date for 2018 and come share your memories of DRU from your days in college. It isn't Homecoming, nor is it designed to be, but regardless of if you can't make it back to campus in the Fall, please consider joining us in the new year.

HOUSEFATHER UPDATE (Jeff Stark)

Yes, for those who don't know, after 30 years, I became Housefather again, although it certainly isn't the same job. You should all know, thanks to John Macy, we have the Clubhouse now, a small bungalow at the corner of Broadway and Hartwell Ave. The upper floor is rented out to 2-4 actives. Carroll now requires students to live in the dorms unless they have "Senior status" so there isn't always a large pool of potential renters.

Assn. for use as the Delta Rho Clubhouse. The main floor has 6 rooms, a fairly large living room with a wide-screen TV that gets the most use, a tiny study room lined with old paddles, a bathroom, a small game room

big enough for a foosball, players and spectators; one room that hasn't quite figured out its use, and an unheated porch which houses the large collection of composites. The basement is available for get-togethers.

John said that when he was an active, I was the only Housefather he ever knew, so he thought of me when he was looking for an "overseer" of the new clubhouse. He knew that my wife had recently died of cancer, and that my children were grown, so asked if I would take on the responsibility. I guess I said yes.

And now we've had the Clubhouse for several years. It's not the new thing any more, to the current actives, we've always had it. The actives try to be careful about protecting the house, although we know there are "accidents" just like in every other house we've had. Actives are responsible for their own repairs, but if not done in a certain time, John has it professionally done and gives the actives the bill. They have cleaning projects, especially before or after events.

The Clubhouse is used for all of our ceremonies, pledge activities (current PC now calls them New Member Training), and meetings when there is not a pledge class. Last year, you almost couldn't enter the house without finding someone playing videogames on the big-screen TV. This year, not so much. Realize that the Clubhouse is twice as far from campus as the old house was. Big games and TV events often draw a crowd. At times the actives have been into cards and board games at the house. When a lot of actives are around, the foosball table gets plenty of use. I bought an industrial strength table when my kids were younger, and have loaned it out to the actives. Of course, we now have some actives who are expert players. I find that the active body is very "alumni friendly," so if you are ever in Waukesha, make a stop at the house and introduce yourself.

Me, I keep an eye on things, usually stopping at the house 3 times a week. including the Monday night active meeting. I let them know if the Clubhouse is in need of cleaning, or make suggestions for upkeep. I think the actives know that John and I always have their backs, if needed for issues among the active body, problems with the University or community. John and I communicate about the group often, but we see ourselves just as a 'livesaver' to the active body when one is needed, yet feel strongly that the fraternity is in their hands now, and we don't interfere. The group is really strong now, with over 50 members. Everyone realizes that having the Clubhouse is a draw for new members, and an asset to the group. Come find out yourself. If you think you'd feel awkward stopping in, give John or I a call, and we'll be glad to go over there with you. We are all Delta Rhos through life.

2016 Distinguished Alumnus Award for Community Service

John Macy's work as managing partner and president of Arenz, Molter, Macy, Riffle, & Larson fills his days with representation of more than 50 Wisconsin municipalities but he still finds time to commit countless volunteer hours within his community.

Macy dedicated more than 1,050 hours to Waukesha County's nonprofit sector in 2014 alone. On almost any given day, he can currently be found volunteering for one of the following agencies: Waukesha County Community Association, Republican Party of Waukesha County or Delta Rho Upsilon Fraternity.

He has also served as past chair of the Sussex Teen Center Improvement Corporation, as executive director of the Stop Underage Drinkers Program through the Waukesha County Tavern League, past chair of the Mediation Center of Waukesha County, and past chair of the Law Explorer Post Committee. Additionally, he serves as a Waukesha County Court Commissioner and was elected in 2013 as chairman of the Republican Party of Waukesha County.

Macy's service extended over the past years to other entities including the American Bar Association, the State Bar of Wisconsin, and the Uniform Law Commission. His volunteer work with American Bar Association was extensive having served on the Board of Governors for 12 years and for the Solo and Small Firm Division for 25 years rising through the ranks to the position of Chair of the Division. His committee assignments with the State Bar of Wisconsin have included volunteer work on almost every committee of the Bar including the Chair of the Board of Governors as well as a High School Mock Trial Tournament judge, We the People Program judge, and National Moot Court judge. The State Bar of Wisconsin recognized him with its Wisconsin Outstanding Leadership Award in 1995-1996 as well as other awards in 1998, 1999, 2000, 2004, and 2010. He was also the recipient of the Sussex Teen Center Service Award as well as numerous other awards for his volunteer work.

The Wisconsin Law Journal recognized Macy in 2009 with its Leader in the Law Award. He is former president of the Waukesha County Bar Association, which recognized him in 1991 with its Award for Dedicated Service and in 2008 as a Distinguished Member.

Other honors include Municipal Lawyer of the Year, Menomonee Falls Wall of Recognition, Who's Who in American Law for 12 years, and Who's Who in America for 10 consecutive years. He has been listed for the last six years in publications featuring the Best Lawyers in America and Top Attorneys in Wisconsin for the last four years.

After graduating cum laude from Carroll in 1977 with a bachelor's degree in political science and English, Macy went on to earn his Juris Doctorate in Law from Marquette University Law School in 1980.

He participated on Carroll's Alumni Council from 1991-2002, as a class agent from 1994–1997, on the President's Advisory Council since 2007, Friends of Carroll College from 1991–2001, and as an active alumnus member of the Delta Rho Upsilon Fraternity. He has served the Delta Rho Upsilon Alumni Association as president, vice president, past president, and on its board of directors between 1979-1990 and 1998-present. He also serves on Carroll's Pre-Law Advisory Council.



Dr. Justin Jacobs ` 03

2016 Distinguished Alumnus Award for Professional Achievement

Dr. Justin Jacobs had hoped in his younger years to become math teacher. Then came the 9/11 attacks at a critical time in his college career, leaving him with images that forced him to question what he could do to help prevent such tragedy from ever happening again.

Then a junior at Carroll, he took a talent for numbers and later sought work with the government, leading to a position as an applied research mathematician for the National Security Agency / Central Security Service (NSA/CSS) within the United States Department of Defense. Today, he utilizes statistical analysis in support of military operations. His specialty is in timing infrastructure and geolocation, allowing him to identify and analyze the Global Navigation Satellite Systems (GNSS). His work also protects other interests that depend on the GNSS architecture, such as wireless networks, Internet timing stability for data packet transfer, and location services for military components.

Dr. Jacobs works with military units abroad to analyze and advise based on signals intelligence. His solution could make the difference in predicting and avoiding an attack. He considers his work a mission of community service.

In 2014, Dr. Jacobs received a Presidential Early Career Award in Science and Engineering and praise from President Barack Obama. It is the highest honor bestowed by the United States government on scientists and engineers in the first five years of their independent research careers. President Obama acknowledged Dr. Jacobs' work for his research and development of geolocation algorithms.

"With unwavering commitment to scientific excellence and technological advancement, you (Dr. Jacobs) are helping carry this tradition forward and keeping America on the cutting-edge of innovation and discovery," President Obama said.

In addition to his government position, Dr. Jacobs also started his own company in 2014, Squared2020 Statistics. He provides statistical consulting and maintains a blog focused primarily on sports analytics, crime analytics, and statistical methodology for business development. He has provided for the prediction of player statistics for the Philadelphia 76ers, delivery of spatiotemporal analytics research to the Charlotte Hornets and distributional analysis on crime data in conjunction with SpotCrime, a city and county crime map web engine showing crime incident data down to neighborhood crime activity.

Dr. Jacobs is currently employed as Principal Research Statistician for Data Science and Cyber Analytics at Sandia National Laboratories; a Federal Funded Research and Development Center (FFRDC) housed out of the Department of Energy.

Dr. Jacobs graduated from Carroll in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in mathematics and computer science. He went on to earn his master's degree in mathematics at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 2005, a master's degree in statistics from University of Maryland- Baltimore County in 2008, and his doctoral degree in statistics also from UMBC in 2014. He is married to fellow Carroll graduate April (Meyer) Jacobs '04 and they have two sons, who are 7 and 3.
