TREASURER REPORT (Wayne Grunewald)

Our cash position improved by \$2,200 during the first 8 months of 2017, as shown below:

\$10,000 Alumni Dues and Additional Contributions

200 Interest Income

(1,800) Actives Dues Reimbursement Program

(1,600) Actives Liability Insurance

(1,500) Actives Clubhouse Rental

(1,000) Alumni Social Events

(1,900) Alumni Communications

(200) Donation to Carroll

\$2,200 Net Income YTD 2017 as of August 31, 2017

Alumni contributed \$10,000 during the first 8 months of 2017, of which \$7,700 (75%) came through donations to Carroll University, with DRU as the designated recipient. This has become an excellent way for DRU Alumni to donate money at the same time to both Carroll and DRU.

65% of our 2017 expenses have been in support of the DRU Active Body, as we have committed to paying for 30% of the Carroll-required liability insurance policy premium and for the Clubhouse rental. Due to our improved financial condition resulting from the 2016 house balloon payment, we have recently agreed to increase our monthly rent payment for the Clubhouse from \$100 per month to \$250 per month to allow for improved Clubhouse services for the Actives. We have also implemented a \$1,800 per semester dues reimbursement program for the Actives to reward community stewardship, DRU commitment and academic achievement. 35% of our 2017 expenses have been in support of Alumni social events and communications.

Your continued financial support is very much appreciated to help pay for our Active Body financial commitments (about \$8,200 per year beginning in 2017) and for DRU Alumni Association ongoing costs.

Tom Sellars joins Delta Rho Upsilon Alumni Kevin Buehler on the Carroll University Board of Trustees

The Carroll University Board of Trustees announced the addition of five new members as it continues work to grow and invest in the campus in many ways. The new members join 25 others on the board who will begin work with incoming president Dr. Cindy Gnadinger beginning on July 1, 2017. She will be the 15th president to lead Carroll University replacing current president Doug Hastad who retired at the end of June.



New Faculty Advisor

He has been serving as an adjunct instructor in the Department of Chemis-



Please be assured that your donations are being put to good use. The Executive Committee for the Alumni Associated voted at on of their last meetings to initiate a dues reimbursement program for the Active Body. The same is structured as follows:

The 10 Active members with the highest number of Panther points (previously know as House Points) at the end of the semester who meet the following criteria will have their upcoming semester dues paid by the Alumni Association.

To receive dues payment an Active must:

- Be in good standing with the school for both the semester they accumulated the points as well as the upcoming semester, and
- Be a full time student for both the semester they accumulated the points as well as the upcoming semester, and
- Have attended at least 2 work project organized by the Vice President, and
- Have attended at least 3 volunteer events organized by the Vice President, and
- Be current in their fraternity dues, and
- Must have a grade point of 2.25, and
- Must not have taken senior standing.
