

TREASURER'S REPORT (Wayne Grunewald)

My last Treasurer's Report to you was after the 2021 third quarter. At that time, we had a 2021 YTD Net Loss of \$5,100, and Carroll was refusing to give us the late 2020 and 2021 YTD monies donated by DRU Alumni for the Fraternity fund. Where are we today?

- Carroll and the DRU Alumni Association agreed to a Dec. 2021 settlement whereby Carroll transferred all DRU Alumni outstanding donations of \$11,875. (page 5)
- The DRU Executive Board determined the prior DRU Clubhouse arrangement between owner John Macy and the DRU active body was no longer an effective working model. Therefore, a new arrangement was enacted that removes Active member Clubhouse rentals and replaces them with a fixed \$800/month payment from the DRU Alumni Association (versus the prior \$250/month), effective Feb. 2022. This plan keeps the Clubhouse as a viable meeting space for the DRU Actives, which was deemed as critical for DRU survival.
- DRU Alumni Assoc. will continue to pay for 30% of the Carroll required liability policy, but will no longer support the Actives Dues Reimbursement Program
- The new ongoing Alumni Association financial support of the Actives will be \$12,000/year (\$9,600 Clubhouse Rental and \$2,400 Liability Insurance)

Since 2013, we have benefited greatly by use of the fund. Our generous members donated monies into the fund and the University allowed us to use the monies to help the Active Body with operating expenses. Over all of these years, the Alumni Association has had an excellent working relationship with the University.

Unfortunately, the original stated uses of the Delta Rho Upsilon Fraternity Fund are no longer in line with the current IRS Charitable Contribution Publication which states that gifts of this nature can only be used for "educational purposes".

DRU Alumni John Heavy and Adam Dachman were featured in the December edition of the Carroll Monthly Alumni Newsletter. Each article in it's entirety can be accessed online at https://connect.carrollu.edu



While growing up in suburban Illinois, <u>John Heavey '14</u> considered a lot of career possibilities: lawyer, politician, journalist, actor. With so many aspirations as a high schooler in 2009, social media was not yet on his radar as something he could do to make a living. That, though, is exactly where his path led over the next decade as he bolstered his know-how of online marketing, sharpened his skills at numerous ad agencies, and eventually became program manager of New Products at Facebook, now Meta.

"I love working with people from all over the world. I've made friends from Paris to London, Japan and Brazil. It's so neat to learn from various cultures and share a common experience at a large tech company," said Heavey, who took the job for the social networking site in March of 2021.

There's a little bit of power in talking to people across the world and social networking," Heavey said. "I think social media allows people to help other people and brings people together with similar passions. I think people naturally want to help and do good. When you create the infrastructure for that, really cool things can happen."

With a love of writing, he came to Carroll focused on a possible journalism career. Then, in his sophomore year, he took a course in public relations taught by an adjunct instructor from the Cramer-Krasselt (CK) agency and imagined how he could combine his love of writing with social media, digital tools, and technology. He said his Carroll education and liberal arts foundation strengthened his abilities to think strategically and critically in his field.

Carroll University <u>Alumnus Adam Dachman '84</u> composed a piece title "Sweetest Thoughts" in the wake of the tragic events that unfolded in Waukesha, Wisconsin during the city's annual Christmas parade. Six people died and 62 were injured when suspect Darrell Brooks, Jr. drove an SUV into the parade participants and crowd.



The day following the Nov. 21 attack, President Cindy Gnadinger released a statement to the Carroll community noting that the parade participants included the school's marching band, color guard, Pio Pete, and a campus shuttle driver who was driving the Carroll float. Additionally, numerous Carroll employees were there with their families to enjoy the parade. While one Carroll student suffered minor physical injuries, no students or employees suffered serious physical injuries during this incident, however, "many suffered trauma of witnessing the tragedy," Dr. Gnadinger shared.

Two days later, Dachman sent the song to Carroll, writing: "I composed and recorded this piece and have dedicated it to Waukesha in the wake of Sunday's tragic events. I think of it as a tribute to those lost and their families." "If for anything, it serves to bring me some healing. Perhaps it will offer others the same."

The song has been paired with images captured on November 30th when the Carroll community gathered at a "CU Hope and Light" event as faculty, staff, and students shared time for healing.

ALUMNUS FEATURE JEFF TRADER '73 | MAY PRUNING YIELDS JUNE BLOOMING



As warmer weather envelopes the country, Jeff Trader '73 has begun working in his 10 gardens, anticipating the summer months when his yard produces exquisite blooms. Jeff's gardens encourage each observer to sit, relax and enjoy. Perennials abound with a touch of annuals for color to delight from early Spring through the Fall.

We took some time to pick his brain about gardening – he is a Master Gardener after all! – and hope these pointers are helpful to you, our alumni and donors, as we breathe in that fresh spring air:

1 What got you into gardening?

2 "When my children didn't need me to watch their sports anymore, I needed a hobby. I'm not a golfer so went with the other 'G' – gardening. About 15 years ago, through encouragement from a friend who is a master gardener, I took classes and after taking the exam, started my avocation as a Master Gardener. Earlier this year, I was named to Honored Status based on my contributions to the organization. I have made a special effort to make community presentations on Perennial Garden Design."

3 3 Tips for Starting a Garden:

- 1. Start with a good base of soil. Work up the new bed and add 6 inches of rich soil mix.
- 2. Take note of whether you have sun or shade. Put taller plants behind the shorter ones.
- 3. Start with plants that are easier to grow and difficult to harm: like a nice bed of hostas.

Fun Fact:

Jeff and his wife Patty will be attending their fourth "Floriade," which is no small feat considering it only happens once every 10 YEARS! This every-tenth-year expo is currently hosted in Almere, one of the youngest cities of the Netherlands.

What Jeff has to say about Carroll:

"Carroll has served me well both in my professional life and general quality of my life. I believe the liberal arts experience from English to psychology to art (with Wis Guthrie), gave me a foundation of enjoying culture. Also, many of my good friends today are from my Delta Rho Upsilon roots which are invaluable to me."

Additionally, Jeff was one of the recruiting products of Shirley Hilger and administered the tour guide program while he attended Carroll.

Dear John,

Sort of an odd salutation and kind of reminds me of an opening to a letter received my freshman year at Carroll. Everything turned out OK, although I was crushed for a while.

In another alumni item, I note that the death of my cousin and DRU alum, Claude Johnson '59, was observed by the DRU alumni group. Of 61 first cousins, I was the first to attend college; Claude, just a year younger, shared most of my cousins and may have added a few more. He carried the same distinction in "going to college." Not too much pressure on him to pledge DRU when he started Carroll! We teamed up my senior year with the DRU football team. I had a conflict with cross country earlier, but as a senior I found a way to do both, intramural football and cross country. Claude ("CJ") at 6' 5" on one side of the line could catch everything I threw his way. Al Thompson, '58 on the other end, Ken Doyle '58, Bernie Roeker'60, Fred "Etna" Bloedow '58, Tom Price '59, were the other regulars in our 6-man team as I recall. It's likely I've left out some important cogs of our "actives" at the time; also I expect pledges were eligible, but, over 64 years, I don't remember any. We won the intramural championship in '57; at the time this was the first touch football title for DRU--and I don't know if any after that. (That intramural field behind "the DRU house" at 242 N. East Avenue is now "buildings", I would guess.)

Many thanks for your efforts in keeping the DRU presence on campus and providing a sense of fellowship for young men. I credit my DRU experience, especially that part of give-and-take while living in "the house," as a big part of forming who I was for the last 3 years at Carroll and who I "am" for the next 64 years. Maybe I should have written "was" instead of "am", but I'm still a work in progress.
